At the 500 acre ranch, explore the meadows, oak chaparral and towering redwoods of Carmel Valley with their escorted equestrian trail rides, one of the unique experiences you'll find staying in Monterey Wine Country. Carmel Valley Ranch, One Old Ranch Road, Carmel.

For a collective Monterey wine experience in a single location, drive further inland to the Santa Lucia Highlands, where the Monterey County Vintners & Growers Celebrate Harvest with a wine tasting event (\$65 pp) replete with grape stomping and pumpkin carving. The event will be held at Paraiso Vineyards on Saturday, October 18, 2014 from 3-6 p.m.
